About the Artist

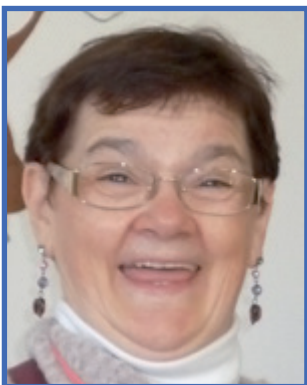

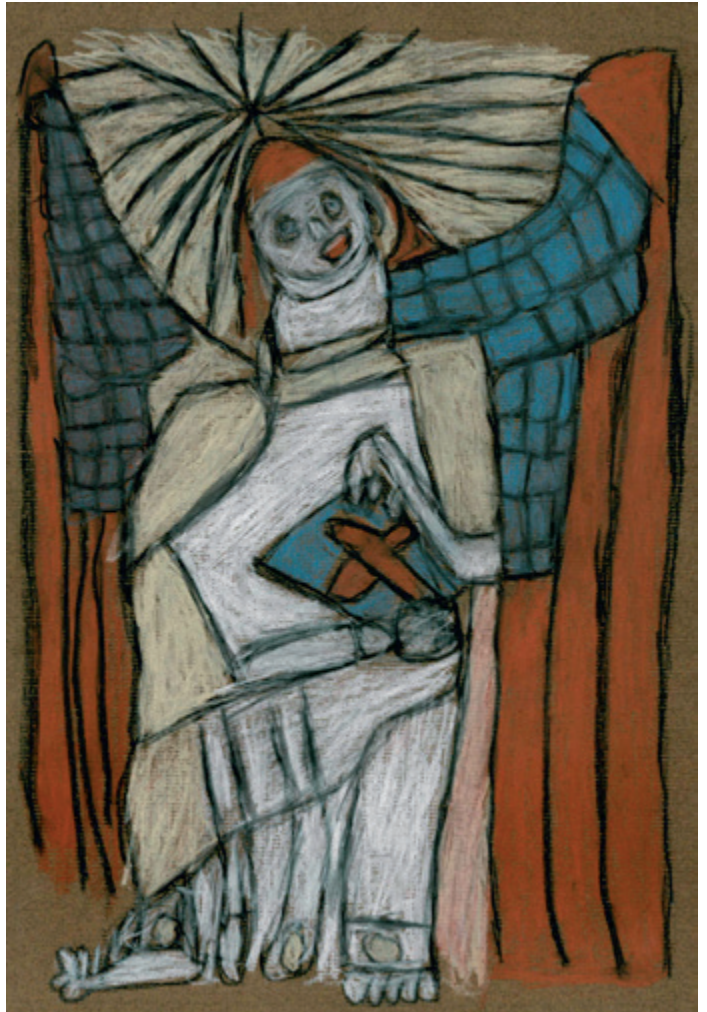
About the Artist

About the Artist

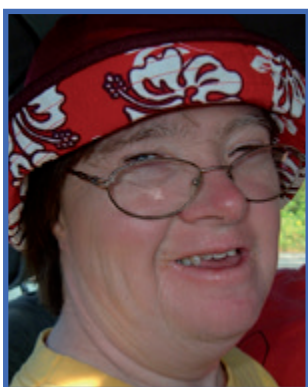

David Peacock is a Scottish artist who has exhibited at the 'The Gallery on the Corner' in Edinburgh's New Town.

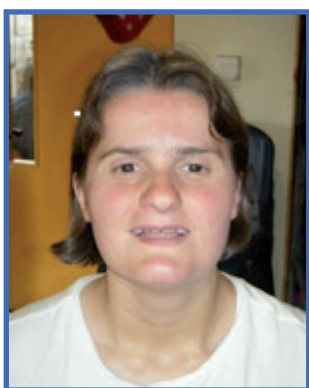
He has lived at The Skein in L'Arche Edinburgh for several years.
